The Seventh Annual Pennsylvania EMS Memorial Service will be held beginning at 1:00 pm on September 11, 2017. All EMS Agencies from across the Commonwealth are invited to demonstrate the EMS community's solidarity by displaying an Emergency Vehicle (ambulance, squad unit, or supervisor's vehicle with EV plates) as, together, we honor and remember EMS providers lost in the line of duty. The Second Annual PA EMS Memorial Bike Ride will be ending their trek from Shanksville at the Memorial Service.

Emergency Vehicles will be parked along Commonwealth Avenue behind the Capitol Building. Participants will gather in the East Wing Rotunda for the Memorial Service.

We ask that all agencies that plan on bringing vehicles register, in advance, so that we can ensure that adequate parking is available. Additional, specific information will be provided to participating organizations when your confirmation is sent.

All Pennsylvania EMS Agency honor guards are encouraged to attend.

We are also looking for volunteers to assist us with the coordination of vehicles and attendees. Detailed information and times will be provided.

Eleventh Annual Stars of Life Dinner Hershey Lodge and Convention Center, Hershey, PA

The Pennsylvania EMS Providers Foundation will be hosting the eleventh annual Stars of Life Dinner on Monday, September 11, 2017. The function, a fundraiser for the Foundation, will be held at the Hershey Lodge and Convention Center in Hershey beginning at 6:00 pm.

The date of September 11th was chosen specifically to honor the emergency responders who gave their lives on September 11, 2001 as well as to honor all Pennsylvania EMS providers for the efforts and importance of the job these everyday heroes provide to residents of this Commonwealth.

These individuals, dedicated to the public they serve, are often forgotten in our day to day lives until the time they are needed. Working long hours in a profession that offers little pay has caused young men and women to no longer choose EMS as a career choice. Newspaper articles from around the country reflect the crisis in EMS staffing showing that recruitment and retention for this important, essential service has become a major concern for the future.

The Ambulance Association of Pennsylvania identified the need to recognize and **retain** our current providers as well as to **recruit** new providers to insure the future of EMS in Pennsylvania. The first annual event was a way to honor our current providers and to begin the formation of a Foundation, now known as the PA EMS Provider Foundation.

Retention

Our legislature, through passage of tax incentives and other SR60 recommendations has recognized the importance of emergency services and the heroic efforts of this industry. This dinner is an opportunity for every provider in Pennsylvania to honor their "heroes." This year, the Foundation will be awarding four grants to EMTs who will be continuing their education and career to become Paramedics.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the PA EMS Provider Foundation for the generous grant I received in 2012. Along with the decision to go "back to school" and being an "older" provider, there was a lot of stress associated with that decision, along with the financial burden. The grant I received covered almost half the cost of my NREMT-P Program, that, along with some help from one of my employers, I was able to complete the program without the burden of the financial stress and I am proud to say that I am now a NREMT-P and working in the state of PA as a Paramedic, in part, due to the generosity of the PA EMS Provider Foundation. Guest Speaker: Raphael M. Barishansky

Raphael M. Barishansky is the Deputy Secretary for Health Planning and Assessment with the Pennsylvania Department of Health. As Deputy Secretary, he is responsible for monitoring, tracking, and analyzing the health status of Pennsylvania communities. Mr. Barishansky currently oversees the management of the Bureaus of Emergency Medical Services, Public Health Preparedness and Community Health Systems.

Prior to joining the Department, Mr. Barishansky served as the Director of the Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS) for the Connecticut Department of Public Health. Prior to that, he served as the Chief of Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response for the Prince George's County (MD) Health Department from 2008 to 2012.



Mr. Barishansky has served as adjunct faculty at both New York Medical College and Yeshiva University and has been a guest lecturer at the George Washington University EMS degree program, the Philadelphia University Disaster Medicine and Management graduate degree program and the George Mason University Biodefense Graduate program.

Mr. Barishansky has authored over 300 articles in such publications as EMS Magazine, the Journal of Emergency Medical Services (JEMS), EMS Insider, Domestic Preparedness Journal, the Journal of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Emergency Management Magazine, Public Safety Communications, and the Crisis Response Journal (UK). He is a nationally known speaker and has made over 100 public presentations at various State, national and International EMS and Public Health conferences.
